

Standish & Co Scholarship 2024 Guidelines, Terms & Conditions

The Standish & Co Scholarship is an opportunity generously funded by Standish & Co, that provides \$10,000 to a student continuing from the Bachelor of Fine Art Program into the Master of Fine Art program and majoring in Photomedia. The recipient is intended to use the funds as a stipend to support living and study expenses. The Scholarship also provides \$5,000 of in-kind printing at Standish & Co over the two years of the MFA degree.

Key Dates

Applications Close: **Monday 13 November 2023.**

Scholarship Announcement: **Thursday 30 November 2023.**

Selection Criteria

The Standish & Co / Look Print Scholarship will be granted to an individual who would benefit from such funding in order to continue their progress into the Master of Fine Art program at the National Art School.

- An exceptional record of artistic achievement and dedication to their artistic practice.
- Genuine need for financial support.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be completing the Bachelor of Fine Art program in 2023 and intending to continue in the Master of Fine Art Program in 2024.
- Applicant must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident.
- Applicant must not be in receipt of any other National Art School Postgraduate Scholarship.

Applications

- Any student who applies to the MFA Program in Photomedia will be considered for this Scholarship.

Conditions

- The successful candidate will need to complete the acquittals process.
- Dispersal of the Scholarship will be on enrolment - \$5,000 in the first year of the MFA and \$5,000 in the second year of the MFA.
- \$2,500 of in-kind printing will be available to the recipient of the Scholarship in each year of the Master of Fine Art degree (\$5,000 in all).
- The Scholarship recipient will be required to begin the first year of the Master of Fine Art in 2024. This Scholarship is not deferrable.
- Should the recipient be unable to complete either year of the Master of Fine Art, they will be required to pay back any funds dispersed.
- Each submission will be considered by a selection panel comprising of representatives from the National Art School.
- The panel may request to meet with the prospective scholarship holder to discuss their application further.

Acquittal of Scholarship

The successful applicant will be required to:

- Take part in a Scholarships and Awards panel discussion at the National Art School in 2025. The successful applicant will be asked to be part of a 15-20 minute formal presentation about the use of the Scholarship.
- Provide high-resolution photographs and a 200 word statement that can be used by NAS for promotional purposes and in publications including the Annual Report and Yearbook.
